



**The following programs of service
are available:**

Adult Mental Health Counseling-
Outpatient treatment that consists of individual, family, and group therapy.

Case Management-
Case management services of linking, monitoring, and advocating for adults living with severe and persistent mental illness.

Supportive Living Services-
Social rehabilitation and basic living skills training provided for adults living with severe and persistent mental illness by peer coaches and rehabilitation staff.

Drop-In Center-
A supportive environment for people living with severe and persistent mental illness to participate in leisure, socialization, and community outings.

Career Service Center-
A vocational program to assist clients in exploring careers, building job-related skills, finding job placement, and maintaining employment.

Medical/Psychiatric Services-
Psychiatric evaluation is a comprehensive evaluation that assesses the client's need for medication and treatment recommendations. Medication Management consists of follow-up appointments to continue to obtain prescribed psychotropic medications and monitor medications for effectiveness and side effects.

Emergency Screening and Receiving Facility-
24 hours a day/7 days a week emergency screening for individuals in Baker County needing to be evaluated for suicidal ideations, homicidal ideations, or inability to care for self which could lead to danger to self or others. A Receiving Facility at NEFSH is available for indigent clients needing inpatient psychiatric hospitalization.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who Needs Help?

Many people come in for help because they have decided that they are involved in difficult situations and are having trouble dealing with them.

These people want to learn ways of dealing and coping with their problems more effectively. Some people have overwhelming problems, but come into treatment because they may feel they are not living up to their full potential. They are dissatisfied with life or have dead-end jobs, troubled family relationships, or are experiencing symptoms that are troubling to them (like anxiety, depression, or insomnia).



What kind of help can I get?

Everyone has different needs. A comprehensive evaluation during the initial appointment combined with your input will determine what services you need. Services can be changed at any time, should your needs change. These services can include mental health counseling, career counseling/coaching, case management, and emergency mental health services/hospitalization as needed.

What does a Mental Health Professional Do?

Help from a mental health professional can be invaluable. A mental health professional is able to assist you in taking a fresh look at your situation. They can help you get a new perspective and insight into



what is bothering you, and assist you in learning to cope more effectively with your problems. A mental health professional is often aware of other services in the community and can tell you where to find them. To sum it up, a mental health professional can help you to learn to deal more efficiently and effectively with problems and concerns.
